Guam has a wealth to offer the visitor to its shores, situated at the southern end of the Mariana Islands, Guam is the gateway to Micronesia.

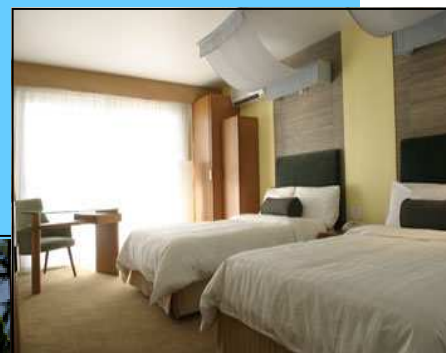
The island reflects an interesting mix of Spanish, American, Japanese and its own Chamorros cultures.

PALAU

The main town of Koror displays a glimpse of Palau history and culture.

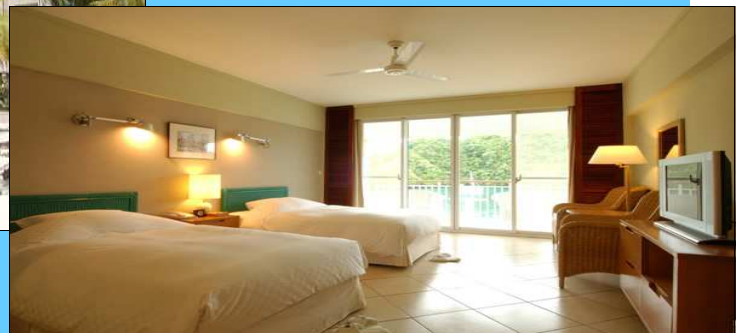

ALLWAYS DIVE EXPEDITIONS

Palau's waters boast some of the world's best reefs and concentrations of the most spectacular marine life in the world. Inquisitive sharks, friendly dolphins, tuna, manta rays and barracuda. All are prolific in the rich Palau waters and every dive holds something new and breathtaking. There are dive sites to suit all levels of experience with the two best sites being "Blue Corner" and "Blue Holes". There are also a number of easily accessible WW2 wrecks, world renowned jellyfish lake and the exquisite Chandelier cave.



BLUE CORNER:

Virtually any living creature can be found on this dive which is rated as Palau's best. Schools of snapper, barracuda, sharks and tuna, swim in the current. Plenty of hard and soft coral abound but experienced dive guides are essential on this dive.

BLUE HOLES:

Spectacular for photography, the beautiful Blue Holes features three connecting holes dropping 110ft to the sand, with access to a sheer drop-off wall at 80ft. The crystal clear water and the various shades of blue encountered as you swim through this magnificent dive site makes the Blue Holes a dive to remember.



JELLYFISH LAKE:

This is a unique experience and an absolute must while in Palau! Trapped centuries ago in this inland lake, thousands of jellyfish live here and is a memorable experience. All have lost their ability to sting, making this an unusual but fantastic snorkel dive.
